

(8) End of Year aggregate points shall be the total of points awarded by the judges in the End of Year competitions.

(10) Alison Thomas Encouragement Award

To be eligible the recipient must have entered all sections of the End of Year competition in either prints or projected.

(12) Projected Image and Print Aggregate Awards

These are given to the competitors who gained the highest monthly competition points in their best nine (9) competitions. To be eligible for aggregate awards the competitor must have entered at least six (6) of the monthly competitions. Runner Up awards for each section will be given on the same basis.

COMPETITION RULES

As amended 25 November 2008

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Competitions are open to all financial members (adult and student) of the Edwardstown Photography Club Incorporated.
- 1.2 The objects of the competitions are:-
 - (1) To provide members with the opportunity to view and compare their work with that of other members by having their work judged by an independent judge or judges.
 - (2) To have the judge discuss the merits of the competition entries and suggest methods by which the artistic and technical qualities may be improved, providing encouragement for an improvement in members' work.
 - (3) Entries which are judged to be of sufficient pictorial and technical quality will receive an award. The award may be a Trophy, or an Honour or Merit Card.
 - (4) To decide by means of certificates and/or other awards which members are adjudged as the foremost exhibitors in the various categories.

2 GENERAL RULES FOR ALL COMPETITIONS

2.1 General Conditions

- (1) Entries which do not comply with these conditions may be rejected by the Committee.
- (2) Copies of paintings and prints are ineligible for competition.
- (3) The Committee is responsible for the grading of the competitors.
- (4) The Committee may, if necessary, institute changes in the format of the competition rules.
- (5) Changes in the conditions of entry, format or rules in any competition must be made before the end of December to become effective in the following year.
- (6) Entries must be the entrant's own work with the only allowable exception being for third party or commercial printing/processing arrangements. The own work criteria shall be applied equally to all aspects of the creative manipulation of images (digital and analogue).
- (7) **Same/Similar image.** From 2009, the re-use of images across prints, slides and digital will not be allowed. An accepted image can be used once (in any medium) in a Monthly competition and once (in any medium) in the Annual Exhibition in any Competition year.

A near identical image, even if sourced from a different file or negative, will be regarded as the same image and may be withdrawn from a competition at the discretion of the Committee and Competition Secretary.

A similar image can be entered provided that it shows observable differences from the originally submitted image. Members are to be encouraged to not enter similar images in the same competition as they will potentially be disadvantaged by competing with themselves.

An image sourced from the same file, negative or transparency that has been significantly altered by the use of creative techniques or changes between colour and monochrome is considered to be a different image. Note that an image that has been slightly cropped, sharpened or had levels, saturation or contrast adjustment will be considered as the same image.

- (2) This list of awards and trophies is subject to change at the discretion of the Committee or the wishes of the donors.
- (3) Awards for Slide and Print of the Year are decided on the assessment of the judges at the End of Year Competitions and will be chosen from the winners in each section in these competitions.
- (4) **HONOURS**
For each section of the End of Year Print competitions a winner shall be chosen from the Top Monochrome and the Top Colour Prints of that section and presented with an Honour Card.
- (5) **TOP PRINTS FROM EACH SECTION**
Shall be selected from those prints awarded Honours in accordance with (4) above.
- (6) **PRINT AND PROJECTED IMAGE OF THE YEAR**
The Print and Projected Image of the Year shall be chosen from those images rewarded with Honour Cards and presented with the appropriate trophies.
- (7) **MERITS**
Merits shall be awarded in all sections of the End of Year Projected Image and Print competitions. (The number of merits awarded in each section shall be limited to approximately 10% of the entries in that section). Merit winners shall be presented with Merit Cards.

2.2 Prints

(1) **Large prints** may be mounted or unmounted and must not be larger than 406 mm x 508 mm (16 x 20 inches) including the mount.

Small Colour Prints must have a :-

Maximum image size of 125 mm x 175 mm (5 x 7 inches); and a Maximum mount size of 200 mm x 300 mm (8 x 10 inches) .

Panoramic Prints. Notwithstanding the maximum print size (including mount) of 16 by 20 inches (40.6 by 50.8 cm), a panoramic print will be accepted in the print competitions provided it is no longer than 64.4 cm (25.4 inches) on its longest side and is no longer than 26 cm (10.3 inches) on its shortest side (including mount), being the measure of two A4 sheets laid end to end.

(2) All prints must have been photographed by the entrant.

(3) The entrant's name must not appear on the front of any print but must be found on the back for identification purposes. An arrow or some indication of the correct hanging position should also be included on the back of the print.

(4) Advanced grade workers in monochrome prints are only eligible to enter Advanced grade Large and Small Colour prints.

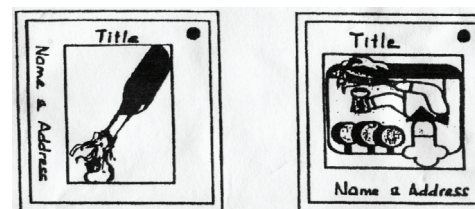
2.3 Slides

(1) Slides must have been photographed but not necessarily processed by the entrant.

(2) All slides must be correctly spotted. That is in the bottom left hand corner when projected. Incorrectly spotted slides may be rejected or projected as spotted.

(3) The entrant's name shall be clearly shown on each slide entered, together with it's title.

(4) The author should where possible, write the title so that it can be clearly read in the projected position.



2.4 Digital Images

- (1) **File Size and Format.** The basis of image size and format will be the nationally accepted standards as defined by the Australian Photographic Society.

The current standards will be available in a separate document and on the club's website.

- (2) All images must have been photographed by the entrant.
- (3) **File Naming Convention.** Digital Image file names will contain the Grade, whether Open or Advanced, the title in upper case, and the entrant's name in lower case. In Set subject competitions the file name will be preceded by the letter S.

Example, Open Competition:
A-STAG-Keith Seidel
O-MOONDOG-Lesley Stroud

Example, Set Subject (eg: "Animals") Competition:
S-A-STAG- Keith Seidel
S-O-MOONDOG-Lesley Stroud

3 COMPETITIONS

3.1 Monthly Competitions

- (1) These are in five (5) sections:-
- (a) Small Colour Prints;
 - (b) Large Colour Prints;
 - (c) Monochrome Prints;
 - (d) Digital Projected Images; and
 - (e) Photographic Slides or Transparencies.
- Different sections may be judged on different evenings according to the program.
- (2) Each section has two (2) grades: 'Advanced' grade and 'Open' grade.
- (3) All points/awards are at the discretion of the judge within the criteria established by the rules.
- (4) Points shall be awarded up to a maximum of ten (10) for each image.
- (5) In each monthly competition the following awards shall be made:-
- HONOURS
- For each grade in each section a winner shall be chosen and presented with an Honour Card.

4 AWARDS

4.1 For Annual and End of Year competitions and for the highest monthly competition aggregate scores.

- (3) These competitions are to be conducted in five (5) sections:-
- Pictorial,
 - Portraiture/People,
 - Nature,
 - Architecture, and
 - Experimental/Creative.
- (4) Entrants are allowed the maximum number of images in each of those sections as follows:-
- PICTORIAL Six (6)
 EXPERIMENTAL/CREATIVE Four (4)
 PORTRAITURE/PEOPLE Four (4)
 NATURE (See following definition) Four (4)
 ARCHITECTURAL Four (4)
- These are over and above the slides and prints entered in the Photo Journalism and Photo Essay competitions.
- (5) All entries in the End of Year competitions should be submitted by the closing dates contained in the official program and accompanied by a correctly completed entry form/s.
- (6) Entrants in the nature sections of these competitions must comply with the following definition of Nature as set out by FIAP and approved by the APS, October 2001.
- Nature photography living untamed animals and uncultivated plants in a natural habitat, geology and the wide diversity of natural phenomena, from insects to icebergs. Photographs of animals which are domesticated, caged or under any form of restraint, as well as cultivated plants are ineligible.
- Minimal evidence of humans is acceptable for nature subjects, such as barn owls and storks adapting to an environment modified by humans or natural forces like hurricanes or tidal waves reclaiming it.
- The original image must have been taken by the photographer whatever photographic medium is used. Any manipulation of the original image is limited to minor retouching of blemishes and must not alter the content of the original scene.
- After satisfying the above requirements, every effort should be made to use the highest level of artistic skill in all nature photographs.

PROJECTED IMAGE OR PRINT OF THE MONTH

The print of the month shall be chosen from the top monochrome and colour prints. The projected image of the month shall be chosen from the top slide and projected digital image. The winner shall be presented with an appropriate trophy or card.

MERITS

Merits shall be awarded in all sections at the discretion of the judge (the number of merits awarded shall approximate 10% of the entries in the section). Merit winners shall be presented with Merit Cards.

NOTE: Notwithstanding the above, if the judge/s consider/s that the quality of entries does not warrant the award of honours or merits then no such awards shall be made.

- Images that have scored 6 points out of 10 or less may be entered in one (1) other monthly competition.
- Any work entered in an annual competition (see rule 3.2) is eligible to be entered in a monthly competition if it has not been previously entered in monthly competition (See rule 3.1.6 above).
- Images cannot be re-entered in a monthly competition when they have been altered by masking, duplication or any other means. (This does not include work used in montages, bas relief or other experimental processes).
- The maximum number of entries in a monthly competition is four (4) prints and/or projected images in each section.
- All print entries must be accompanied by a correctly completed entry form and must be in the hands of the respective Competition Secretaries by 7.45 pm on the night of the competition. Entries received after this time will not be accepted.
- Beginning in February in each year there will be ten (10) monthly competitions of which at least three (3) and no more than five (5) shall be Set Subject competitions.
 - The first monthly competition will be 'Open'.
 - The Set Subjects will be chosen by the Committee from year to year.

3.2 Annual Competitions

NOTE With the exception of work entered in the Audio Visual competition (see Rule 3.2.1) all work entered in all other Annual Competitions (As defined in Rules 3.2.2 and 3.2.4) must be the current year's work taken or made by the entrant and the image produced/ processed during the current year.

The current year being defined as the period between the first of the month fourteen (14) months prior to the month set down in the official program for the conduct of these annual competitions.

The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry, print or slide which they consider has been entered before or does not comply with the definition of current year's work.

3.2.1 Audio Visual Competitions

- (1) This competition shall be held on a date to be fixed by the Committee in the official program.
- (2) The competition is divided into two (2) sections: one for single projection and one for multi projection presentations.
- (3) General rules for audio visual competitions:-
 - (a) Entries are to be of no more than ten (10) minutes duration.
 - (b) All slides used must be the author's own work.
 - (c) Audio visual presentations can be prepared co-operatively by two (2) or more authors.

3.2.2 Photo Journalism Competitions

Photo journalism is a record of any event which tells a story of what has happened, is happening or is about to happen, the sight of which excites or stimulates one of the human emotions. **Set up portraits are excluded.**

- (1) This competition is to be held annually on a date to be fixed by the Committee and is set out together with the closing date for entries in the official program each year.
- (2) Images entered in these competitions must comply with all competition rules.
- (3) Any images entered in this competition are ineligible for entry in any section of the End of Year Competition. However, they may be entered in a monthly competition. (See Rule 3.1.(6)).
- (4) Competitors may enter a maximum of four (4) images in each section of this competition.

3.2.3 Photo Essay Competitions

A photo essay comprises a set of four (4) images which when viewed together tell a story.

- (1) This is to be held on a date to be fixed by the Committee and set out together with the closing date in the official program each year.
- (2) Images entered in this competition must comply with all competition rules.
- (3) Images entered in this competition are ineligible for entry in any section of the End of Year Competition. However, they may be entered in a monthly competition. (See Rule 3.1(6)).
- (4) Entrants may enter a maximum of two (2) sets of four (4) images in a photo essay competition.
- (5) **Prints.** Each set of prints must be displayed on one mount. The size of the mount shall accommodate up to a maximum of four (4) prints up to A4 size with a maximum border of 5 centimetres on the edges.

3.2.4 Photographic Project

The photographic project is a theme to be chosen by the Committee from year to year, the definition of which is to be set out in the official program each year.

- (1) This competition is to be held annually on a date to be fixed by the Committee and is set out together with the closing date for entries in the official program each year.
- (2) Images entered in these competitions must comply with all competition rules.
- (3) Any images entered in this competition are ineligible for entry in any section of the End of Year Competition. However, they may be entered in a monthly competition. (See Rule 3.1.(6)).
- (4) Competitors may enter a maximum of four (4) images in each section of this competition.

3.2.5 End of Year Competition

- (1) These are to be conducted as:-
 - (a) The End of Year Print Competition, and
 - (b) The End of Year Projected Image Competition.
- (2) They are to be conducted on separate dates to be fixed by the Committee and set out, together with the closing dates for entries in the official program each year.
